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Tips for Collecting Food Scraps and Dropping Off

- Collect your food scraps at home in a tightly sealed container and consider putting it in the refrigerator or freezer between drop-off visits. This may also help minimize potential odors.
- Don't forget to remove produce stickers, twist ties, and rubber bands from all food scraps before placing in your collection container.
- BPI certified compostable bags may start to break down, especially with wet items. Consider emptying scraps into your bags right before going to the drop-off and/or use a rigid tote or pail for tidy transport.
- Have neighbors that want to participate? Consider setting up a compost carpool to pick up and drop off your combined scraps!
